Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 13, 2018

This Interim Management Report of Fund Performance is intended to present the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook since March 31, 2018, the Fund's last fiscal year-end. For information on the Fund's longer-term performance, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report. In this report, "Counsel" refers to Counsel Portfolio Services Inc., the manager of the Fund.

In addition, net asset value (NAV) refers to the value of the Fund or a series as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund's Series A securities is discussed below. The performance of all other series offered by the Fund is shown in the *Past Performance* section of this report. Series returns may differ for a number of reasons, including if the series was not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period and because of different levels of fees and expenses charged to each series. Please refer to the *Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by series.

During the six-month period, the Fund's Series A securities returned 2.67% (after deducting fees and expenses). This compares with a 7.08% return of the broad-based MSCI World Total Return Index and a 5.56% return of the mandate-specific MSCI World Small Cap Total Return Index. All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, none of which are reflected in the index returns.

The Fund underperformed the broad-based MSCI World Total Return Index. The broad-based index is designed to measure the performance of the overall developed large cap equity markets, whereas the Fund invests with a focus on small cap equities. Given the Fund's composition, the mandate-specific index provides a more meaningful comparison for relative performance.

The Fund underperformed the mandate specific index due to its U.S. mandate, sub-advised by Invesco, which returned 5.99%, underperforming the Russell 2000 Total Return Index, which returned 11.61%. Stock selection within the Financials and Consumer Discretionary sectors detracted to performance, while other sectors failed to meaningfully contribute. Negative performance was also attributed to the cash drag effect of the sub-advisor choosing to hold 20% of assets in cash.

The Fund's Canadian mandate, sub-advised by Mackenzie, returned 4.56%, outperforming the S&P/TSX Small Cap Index, which returned 3.59%. Security selection within Consumer Discretionary, Health Care, and Information Technology sectors contributed. Being underweight in the poorly performing Materials sector also contributed to performance.

The Fund's international mandate, sub-advised by Wasatch, contributed positively to the overall performance of the Fund. The Mandate returned 3.28% outperforming the MSCI EAFE Small Cap Total Return Index, which returned -2.18%. Specifically, security selection within the Health Care and Financials sectors in Germany and the U.K. and selection within the Industrials and Information Tech sectors in Japan and Australia, were the main contributors to returns.

Between April 1, 2018 and June 6, 2018, the Fund's target hedge against the U.S. Dollar ("USD") ranged from 25% to 50%. The hedge was removed on June 6, 2018. During the six-month period, the USD appreciated 0.32% against the Canadian Dollar ("CAD"). As a result, the currency hedge detracted from the Fund's performance.

The Fund was generally unhedged against international currencies, other than the USD. During the period, the CAD appreciated by 5.56% against a broad basket of international currencies, as weighted in the MSCI EAFE index. As a result, the Fund's foreign currency exposure had a negative impact on performance.

Net Assets

The Fund's NAV declined by \$12.7 million, or 3.1%, to \$401.2 million as at September 30, 2018, from \$413.9 million at March 31, 2018. Of this decrease, \$29.1 million was attributable to net redemptions and partially offset by a \$16.4 million increase due to investment performance (after deducting fees and expenses).

Certain other Counsel Funds ("Top Funds") and/or investment products managed by Counsel's affiliates have large investments in the Fund, see *Other Related Party Transactions* for details. As a result of these investments, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Simplified Prospectus. Counsel manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the value of the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions.

Fees and Expenses

The Management Expense Ratio ("MER") for Series A of 2.50%, during the period ended September 30, 2018, was slightly higher than the MER of 2.51% for the year ended March 31, 2018. The MERs (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

Wasatch notes that emerging-market equities encountered trouble earlier in the year amid worries that the trade dispute between the U.S. and China might develop into a full-scale global trade war. In September, two separate measures of Chinese factory activity came in weaker than expected, reflecting China's economic slowdown and the impact of tariffs on the country's export manufacturers. A key importer of raw materials, components and finished goods from other countries, China functions as a locomotive of growth for other emerging markets. Developing nations now face the prospect of shrinking exports to China at a time when strength in the USD threatens to raise the cost of servicing USD-denominated debt taken on in the years following the global financial crisis.

Invesco moved to bring its cash levels down during the period as its cash holdings were a drag on performance.

Mackenzie, which is underweight Canadian Energy stocks, notes that Canadian small caps tend to benefit when the oil & gas sector is doing well. While that was the case through much of the period, the sector did not do as well as might have been expected as the Canadian Energy sector has had a big discount applied to it due to pipeline constraints.

In August, Counsel increased the weighting to the International mandate from 50% to 60%, and reduced each of the U.S. Small Cap and Canadian Small Cap mandates from 25% to 20%.

Subsequent to the end of the period, the Fund re-introduced its target hedge against the USD gradually increasing it to 95%. The USD hedge is dynamic and may vary between 0-100% at Counsel's discretion based on its assessment of currency market conditions. The Fund is expected to remain generally unhedged against currencies other than the USD for the foreseeable future.

Effective October 29, 2018, the Fund's risk rating was adjusted from medium-to-high to medium.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to Counsel at the annual rates specified under *Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Simplified Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, Counsel pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

Other investment funds managed by Counsel (“Top Funds”) invest in Series O securities offered by the Fund on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. Series Private Wealth securities are issued on a prospectus-exempt basis to investors in the IPC Private Wealth program offered by IPC Securities Corporation, an affiliate of Counsel. At September 30, 2018, Top Funds owned 74.3% of the Fund’s NAV and Series Private Wealth investors owned 21.5% of the Fund’s NAV. As of September 30, 2018, Counsel had not received notice of any large redemptions. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day.

The Fund did not rely on an approval or positive recommendation from the Counsel Funds’ Independent Review Committee (“IRC”) with respect to any related party transactions. The Fund has relied on standing instructions from the IRC with respect to asset re-allocations.

Management Fees

The Fund’s management fees were used by the Manager to pay for: costs of managing the investment portfolio; providing investment analysis and recommendations; making investment decisions; the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio; and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund commission payments and other compensation (collectively, “Distribution Related Payments”) paid to the dealers and brokers for securities of the Fund bought and held by investors.

The following dealers, who are affiliated with Counsel, may be entitled to Distribution Related Payments from Counsel on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation, Investors Group Financial Services Inc. and Quadrus Investment Services Ltd.

During the period, approximately 40% of the total management fee revenues received from all Counsel funds were used to fund Distribution Related Payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such Distribution Related Payments for the Fund represented 42% of the management fees paid. This amount is an average percentage of the management fees paid by all series. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.

Series Information

The Fund may issue an unlimited number of securities for each series. The number of issued and outstanding securities of each series is disclosed in *Financial Highlights*. A 10-year history of the major changes affecting the Fund can be found in the Fund’s Annual Information Form, available at www.counsel-services.com.

¹ As described in the Fund’s Simplified Prospectus, securities of this series purchased under the sales charge purchase option may be subject to a fee of up to 5%; securities purchased under the redemption charge or low-load purchase options may be subject to a redemption fee of up to 6% or 3% respectively.

² A negotiable advisory or asset-based fee (plus sales taxes) is payable by investors to their dealer(s) in connection with the securities held in this series. The fee may be collected by Counsel from the investor’s account through redemption of securities and remitted to the dealer at the investor’s request. Alternatively, the dealer may collect it directly from the investor. Investors in this series may be eligible for a management fee reduction subject to meeting certain requirements as discussed in the Fund’s Simplified Prospectus.

³ Securities of this series are not subject to sales charges or redemption charges.

⁴ The management fee for this series is 1.10% and is payable directly to Counsel generally through the monthly redemption of securities.

⁵ There are no management or administration fees for this series since these securities are designed to facilitate fund-of-fund investing where duplication of management fees is prohibited.

⁶ There are no management fees for Series Private Wealth. An investor must enter into an agreement to participate in the IPC Private Wealth Program and agree to pay certain asset-based fees.

⁷ Counsel may, at its discretion, waive or lower the management fee (either directly or indirectly) and/or administration fee payable by investors.

⁸ Prior to October 27, 2017, this series was called Series D.

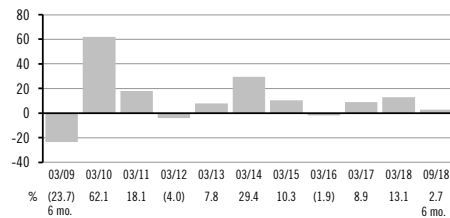
- In January 2010, the Fund began to pay an administration fee. In exchange, the Manager began to pay certain operating costs and expenses that had previously been paid by the Fund.

Year-by-Year Returns

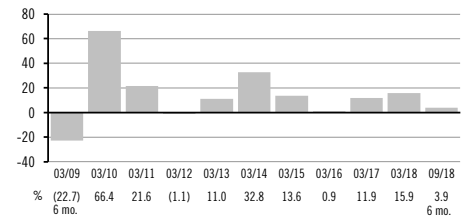
The bar chart shows how much an investment made on the first day of each financial year would have increased or decreased by the end of the respective periods. For the first year of a series, the percentage

shown will be the actual return of the series from its inception date, which can be found under *Series Information*. The chart illustrates how the Fund's performance has changed over time.

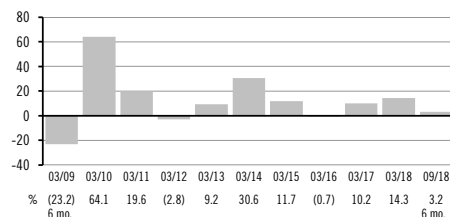

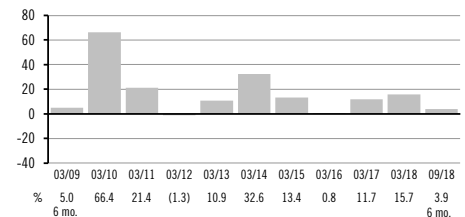

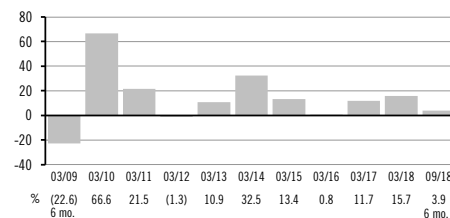
