Management Discussion of Fund Performance

July 13, 2020

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the views of Counsel Portfolio Services Inc. (“Counsel”) on the significant factors and developments during the year ended March 31, 2020 that have affected the Fund’s performance and outlook. For information on the Fund’s longer-term performance, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report.

In addition, net asset value (NAV) refers to the value of the Fund or a series, as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks long-term growth of capital, while maintaining a commitment to the protection of its capital by investing primarily in international equity securities. The Fund’s approach to investment selection is value driven. The Fund may also invest in equity and fixed income securities of issuers anywhere in the world depending upon prevailing market conditions.

In May 2019, the sub-advisor for Counsel International Value was changed to Thompson, Siegel & Walmsley LLC (“TSW”). The Fund’s holdings were revised to reflect securities selected by TSW. Concurrently, approximately 35% of the Fund’s assets were invested in securities to mimic a multi-factor international equity index provided by Scientific Beta. In November 2019, this allocation was removed and TSW became the sole sub-advisor for the Fund.

Risk

Despite recent volatility related to the global pandemic, the risks of investing in the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund’s Simplified Prospectus. The Fund is suitable for investors who: seek an international equity fund to hold as part of their portfolio; want a long-term investment; can handle the ups and downs of stock markets; and have a medium tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund’s Series A securities is discussed below. The performance of all other series offered by the Fund is shown in the *Past Performance* section of this report. Series returns may differ for a number of reasons, including if the series was not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period and because of different levels of fees and expenses charged to each series. Please refer to the *Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by series.

During the year, the Fund’s Series A securities returned -16.92% (after deducting fees and expenses). This compares with a -8.78% return of the broad-based MSCI EAFE Index, and a -17.71% return of the style-based MSCI EAFE Value Index. All series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, none of which are reflected in the index returns.

The Fund underperformed the broad-based index primarily due to security selection within the Industrials and Health Care sectors. The broad-based index is designed to measure the performance of the overall international equity market, whereas the Fund invests with a focus on value-oriented equities. Given the Fund’s composition, the style-based index provides a more meaningful comparison for relative performance.

The Fund outperformed the style-based index due to security selection within Information Technology and Consumer Discretionary sectors.

The Fund was unhedged against the Euro (“EUR”) for most of the year but introduced a 25% target hedge against the EUR on February 28, 2020. The Fund remained un-hedged against the Japanese Yen (“JPY”) and British Pound (“GBP”) for the 12-month period. Over this period, the Canadian dollar (“CAD”) depreciated by 3.59%, 1.07%, and 8.65% against the EUR, GBP, and JPY respectively. As a result, these currency exposures had a positive impact on the Fund’s performance.

Net Assets

The Fund’s NAV declined by \$193.5 million, or 59.3%, to \$132.8 million as at March 31, 2020, from \$326.3 million at March 31, 2019. Of this decrease, \$178.2 million was attributable to net redemptions and \$15.3 million due to investment performance (after deducting fees and expenses).

Fees and Expenses

The Management Expense Ratio (“MER”) for Series A of 2.57%, during the year ended March 31, 2020, was slightly lower than the MER of 2.58% for the year ended March 31, 2019. The MERs for all series (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) are presented in the Financial Highlights section of this report.

Recent Developments

Governments worldwide have enacted emergency measures to combat the spread of the COVID-19 virus in the last several months. These measures have caused significant volatility and weakness in global equity markets and material disruption to businesses globally, resulting in an economic slowdown. Governments and central banks have reacted with significant monetary and fiscal interventions to stabilize economic conditions.

The duration and impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on business and markets, and the extent of economic relief measures provided by

governments and central banks, are unknown at the reporting date and it is therefore not possible to reliably estimate the impact on the financial results and position of the Fund in future periods.

TSW notes that the COVID-19 pandemic has produced a highly uncertain short-term outlook for the global economy and financial markets. Many companies have scrapped forecasts and financial guidance for 2020 and have announced plans to cut operating expenses and conserve capital by suspending dividends and share repurchase plans, and postponing capital spending. The sub-advisor’s focus is on re-examining the financial position of companies in the Fund under this extreme economic scenario and understanding how management teams are adjusting to the evolving situation. The Fund is overweight Japan. On a sector basis, the Fund is overweight Information Technology and Consumer Staples. Utilities represent the Fund’s most underweight sector.

After such a dramatic downturn in the first quarter of 2020, every economic sector and country participated in a healthy stock market recovery in the second quarter, partially in reaction to indiscriminate selling in the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic. Supercharged stimulus efforts by world governments, central banks and feverish investor psychology also played a role in investors rushing back into stock markets. Historically low interest rates and distorted corporate cash flows lend imprecision to traditional valuation measures and techniques, but price always matters eventually, and the sub-advisor believes that the markets will recognize this fact. Global political issues, most notably the U.S. election, may begin to push aside pandemic news and drive continued market volatility in the second half of 2020.

The Fund’s target hedge of 25% against the Euro continues to be maintained. Counsel may also establish hedges against exposure to the British Pound and Japanese Yen. Currency hedging is dynamic and may vary between 0-100% at our discretion based on our assessment of currency market conditions.

In Q3 2020, Counsel will expand its ESG (environmental, social and governance) program such that it will prohibit investments in companies that are:

- severe violators of social norms including human rights, labour rights, the environment, and corruption based on Principles of the U.N. Global Compact and the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises.
- primarily (50% or greater) in the business of manufacturing and distributing tobacco products
- deriving at least 30% of their revenue from coal mining or generating power where the output is derived at least 30% from the use of coal
- manufacturing banned or controversial weapons that can have a disproportionate and indiscriminate impact on civilian population.

The Fund’s holdings are not expected to be materially impacted by the prohibitions.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to Counsel at the annual rates specified under *Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Simplified Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, Counsel pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

Other investment funds managed by Counsel (“Top Funds”) invest in Series O securities offered by the Fund on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. Series Private Wealth securities are issued on a prospectus-exempt basis to investors in the IPC Private Wealth program offered by IPC Securities Corporation, an affiliate of Counsel. At March 31, 2020, Top Funds owned 71.2% of the Fund’s NAV and Series Private Wealth investors owned 23.1% of the Fund’s NAV. During the year, the Fund experienced significant redemptions by Top Fund and IPC Private Wealth investors. As of March 31, 2020, Counsel had not received notice of any additional large redemptions. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day.

The Fund relied on positive recommendations from the Counsel Funds Independent Review Committee (“IRC”) with regards to asset re-allocations. Additionally, the Fund relied on standing instructions from the IRC with regards to its sub-advisor change, sales of securities to IPC Multi-Factor International Equity, and transactions of securities related to the Manager.

Management Fees

The Fund’s management fees were used by the Manager to pay for: costs of managing the investment portfolio; providing investment analysis and recommendations; making investment decisions; the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio;

and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund commission payments and other compensation (collectively, “Distribution Related Payments”) paid to the dealers and brokers for securities of the Fund bought and held by investors.

The following dealers, who are affiliated with Counsel, may be entitled to Distribution Related Payments from Counsel on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation, Investors Group Financial Services Inc. and Quadrus Investment Services Ltd.

During the year, approximately 34% of the total management fee revenues received from all Counsel funds were used to fund Distribution Related Payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such Distribution Related Payments for the Fund represented 45% of the management fees paid. This amount is an average percentage of the management fees paid by all series. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series. As Series E of this Fund pays lower management fees than Series A of most other Counsel Funds while paying the same trailer fee, Distribution Related Payments comprise a higher proportion of the Fund’s management fee than the average for all Counsel Funds.

Series Information

The Fund may issue an unlimited number of securities for each series. The number of issued and outstanding securities of each series is disclosed in *Financial Highlights*. ¹ As described in the Fund’s Simplified Prospectus, securities of this series purchased under the sales charge purchase option may be subject to a fee of up to 5%. Securities purchased under the redemption charge or low-load purchase options may be subject to a redemption fee of up to 6% or 3% respectively; new securities are not available under these purchase options but may be acquired through switching from other Counsel funds. Effective April 1, 2020, investors in this series may be eligible for a management fee reduction subject to meeting certain requirements as discussed in the Fund’s Simplified Prospectus.

² A negotiable advisory or asset-based fee (plus sales taxes) is payable by investors to their dealer(s) in connection with the securities held in this series. The fee may be collected by Counsel from the investor’s account through redemption of securities and remitted to the dealer at the investor’s request. Alternatively, the dealer may collect it directly from the investor. Investors in this series may be eligible for a management fee reduction subject to meeting certain requirements as discussed in the Fund’s Simplified Prospectus.

³ Securities of this series are not subject to sales charges or redemption charges.

⁴ The management fee for this series is 0.90% and is payable directly to Counsel generally through the monthly redemption of securities.

⁵ There are no management or administration fees for this series since these securities are designed to facilitate fund-of-fund investing where duplication of management fees is prohibited. This series may pay monthly distributions of net income to minimize risks associated with large redemption by other Counsel funds.

⁶ There are no management fees for Series Private Wealth. An investor must enter into an agreement to participate in the IPC Private Wealth Program and agree to pay certain asset-based fees.

⁷ Counsel may, at its discretion, waive or lower the management fee (either directly or indirectly) and/or administration fee payable by investors.

⁸ This series is not available for purchase.

Past Performance

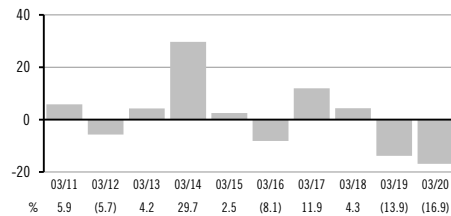

Year-by-Year Returns

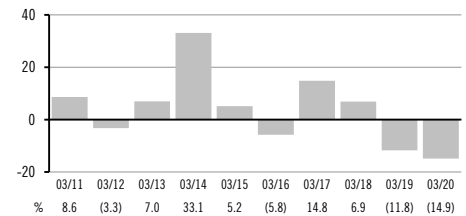
The bar chart shows how much an investment made on the first day of each financial year would have increased or decreased by the end of the respective periods. For the first year of a series, the percentage

shown will be the actual return of the series from its inception date, which can be found under *Series Information*. The chart illustrates how the Fund's performance has changed over time.

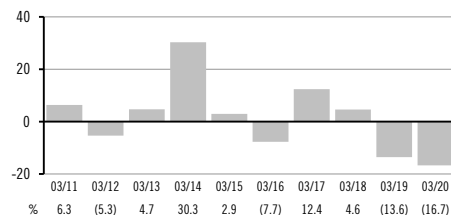

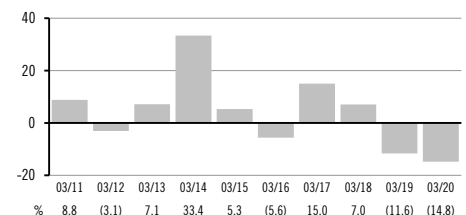

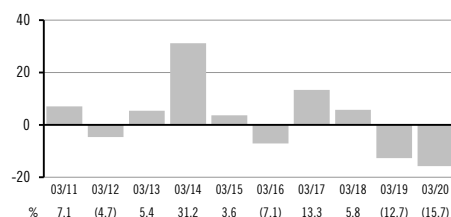

A two dimensional framework is used for style segmentation in which MSCI EAFE stocks are segmented into value-oriented and growth-oriented are categorized using a multi-factor approach, which uses three variables to define the value investment style characteristics and five variables to define the growth investment style characteristics including forward looking variables.

A PTR of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher PTR in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high PTR and the performance of the Fund. Costs incurred to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, are excluded from the PTR.



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
