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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 5, 2023

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the views of Counsel Portfolio Services Inc. (“Counsel”) on the significant factors and developments during the year ended March 31, 2023 that have affected the Fund’s performance and outlook. For information on the Fund’s longer-term performance, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report.

In addition, net asset value (NAV) refers to the value of the Fund or a series, as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks to provide long-term capital growth by investing, in equity securities of companies either directly or indirectly through other investment funds, around the world while seeking to reduce absolute volatility.

Risk

The risks of investing in the Fund generally remain as discussed in the Fund’s initial Simplified Prospectus. The Fund is suitable for investors who: seek exposure to global equity securities; want a medium to long term investment; can handle the volatility of stock markets; and have a low to medium tolerance for risk. The Fund is only available on a prospectus-exempt basis and is not available to registered investors.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund’s Series O securities is discussed below. The performance of all other series offered by the Fund is shown in the *Past Performance* section of this report. Where series returns differ, it is primarily because different levels of fees and expenses were charged to each series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by series.

During the year, the Fund’s Series O securities returned 3.47%. This compares with an 0.74% return of the broad-based MSCI World Index. All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses, and commissions, none of which are reflected in the index returns.

Global equities fell over the period as economic forecasts weakened, although currency movements generally boosted returns in Canadian dollar terms. Employment remained strong. In response to persistently high inflation, the U.S. Federal Reserve and the European Central Bank increased their policy rates significantly. Higher interest rates contributed to a crisis in the U.S. banking system in March 2023, which affected banks in Europe. Within the MSCI World (Net) Index, Denmark, Ireland and Spain were the strongest-performing markets, while Norway, Israel and Canada were the weakest. The Energy, Consumer Staples and Industrials sectors were the strongest performers, while Real Estate, Communication Services and Consumer Discretionary were the weakest.

The Fund outperformed the MSCI World Index primarily due to security selection within the Health Care and Consumer Discretionary sectors, as well as security selection within the United States. The Fund’s objective is to invest in lower volatility stocks which traditionally have a lower correlation to equity markets and the Fund benefitted from less exposure to decreasing markets.

During the year, the U.S. dollar (“USD”), Euro (“EUR”), and British Pound (“GBP”) appreciated 8.22%, 6.10%, and 1.88% respectively against the Canadian dollar (“CAD”) contributing to the Fund’s performance as it was unhedged against foreign currencies. The Japanese Yen (“JPY”) depreciated 0.78% against the CAD detracting from the Fund’s performance.

Net Assets

The Fund’s NAV declined by \$17.5 million, or 19.2%, to \$73.7 million as at March 31, 2023, from \$91.2 million at March 31, 2022. Of this decrease, \$19.6 million was attributable to net redemptions and slightly offset by a \$2.1 million increase due to investment performance.

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio (“MER”) for each series during the year ended March 31, 2023, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2022. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. Please note that no management fees are charged to the Fund; see the *Series Information* section of this report for further details. The MERs for all series (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The sub-advisor notes that equity markets were volatile but resilient in the first quarter of 2023 and they will continue to face various challenges in the short term. There are multiple headwinds such as inflation, slowing economic growth, uncertainty regarding the trajectory of central bank policy, and geopolitical issues including the Russia/Ukraine crisis, while uncertainty in the banking sector has the potential to negatively impact sentiment and credit creation. Moreover, while inflation has decelerated from six months ago, price pressures remain elevated and tighter credit conditions have the potential to crimp demand, resulting in potential pressure on corporate earnings and margins. Given the headwinds faced by equity markets in the short term, and in particular the potential downside from a recessionary environment, the sub-advisor sees risks in equities as being skewed to the downside in the coming months. However, while the outlook for equity markets suggests limited upside in the short term, it remains positive over the medium to long term, and the sub-advisor expects equities to deliver positive returns over that longer timeframe.

The Fund is expected to remain unhedged against foreign currencies subject to Counsel’s discretion based on its assessment of currency market conditions.

On April 3, 2023, The Canada Life Assurance Company announced an agreement to acquire Investment Planning Counsel Inc. (the parent company of Counsel). The transaction is expected to be completed within 2023. Counsel will continue operate as manager of the Counsel Funds and the agreement is not expected to impact the Fund’s operations.

Effective March 31, 2023, KPMG LLP was appointed as the auditor of the Fund.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

Top Funds represent nearly all of the Fund’s investors. As a result, Counsel pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund. No management or administration fees are paid by the Fund.

Other Related Party Transactions

Other investment funds managed by Counsel (“Top Funds”) invest in Series O securities offered by the Fund on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. As a result of these investments, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Counsel Funds’ Simplified

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Prospectus. Counsel manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions. At March 31, 2023, Top Funds owned nearly 100% of the Fund's NAV. As of March 31, 2023, Counsel had not received any additional notice of large redemptions. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day.

During the year, the Fund relied on standing instructions from the Counsel Funds' Independent Review Committee ("IRC") with respect to trades with other Counsel Funds.



Past Performance

The indicated rates of return are the historical annual compound total returns, including changes in NAV per security and assuming reinvestment of all distributions. They do not take into account sales, redemption, distribution or optional sales charges, management fees directly payable by investors or income taxes payable by any investor that would have reduced returns. (3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of the daily average NAV during the period. Where the Fund invests in securities of an Underlying Fund, the TERs presented for the Fund include the portion of TERs of its Underlying Fund(s) attributable to this investment.

(4) The portfolio turnover rate ("PTR") indicates how actively the portfolio advisor manages the investments. A PTR of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher PTR in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high PTR and the performance of the Fund. Costs incurred to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, are excluded from the PTR.
