Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 11, 2021

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the views of Counsel Portfolio Services Inc. (“Counsel”) on the significant factors and developments during the period ended September 30, 2021 that have affected the Fund’s performance and outlook. For information on the Fund’s longer-term performance, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report.

In addition, net asset value (NAV) refers to the value of the Fund or a series, as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund’s Series O securities is discussed below. The performance of all other series offered by the Fund is shown in the *Past Performance* section of this report. Where series returns differ, it is primarily because different levels of fees and expenses were charged to each series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by series.

During the six-month period, the Fund’s Series O securities returned 9.03%. This compares with an 8.59% return of the MSCI World Index (the “Index”). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses, and commissions, none of which are reflected in the index returns.

The period was characterized by rising commodity prices, supply chain issues and rolling economic interruptions worldwide due to the emergence of the COVID-19 Delta variant. In China, efforts to regulate e-commerce, online gaming and for-profit education led to a sharp decline in equity valuations. Despite the largest monthly decline of 2021 in September, global markets ended the period higher. Within the MSCI World Index, Austria, Denmark and the Netherlands were the strongest-performing countries, while Hong Kong, New Zealand and Germany were the weakest. The Information Technology, Health Care and Energy sectors were the strongest performers, while Utilities, Materials and Industrials were the weakest.

The sub-advisor employs a multi-factor quantitative investment signal, which weighs momentum, valuation, and macroeconomic factors to determine the Fund’s investment level in global equity markets versus cash. The quantitative signal moves on a daily basis which triggers adjustments to the allocation between equities and cash, which can vary between 100% equities or 100% cash.

While being fully invested in equities, the Fund slightly outperformed the Index. The outperformance was mostly due to the impact of Counsel’s Environmental, Social, and Governance (“ESG”) filter which removes specific equities that are included in the Index. based on the criteria. The stocks excluded from the Fund’s portfolio underperformed the Index.

During the period, the U.S. dollar (“USD”) and the Japanese Yen (“JPY”) appreciated 0.75% and 0.21% respectively against the Canadian dollar (“CAD”). As a result, these exposures contributed to returns. The Euro (“EUR”) and British Pound (“GBP”) depreciated 0.48% and 1.23% respectively against the CAD detracting from the Fund’s performance.

Net Assets

The Fund’s NAV increased by \$16.2 million, or 6.9%, to \$252.7 million as at September 30, 2021, from \$236.5 million at March 31, 2021. Of this increase, \$21.0 million was attributable to investment performance and partially offset by \$4.8 million of net redemptions.

Fees and Expenses

The Management Expense Ratio (“MER”) for Series O of 0.00%, during the period ended September 30, 2021, was slightly lower than the MER of 0.01% for the year ended March 31, 2021. No expenses (including management or administration fees) are charged to Series O, other than certain specific fund costs (primarily interest).

Recent Developments

Ongoing uncertainty regarding the duration and long-term impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and the implementation of vaccination programs, as well as the efficacy of government and central bank monetary and fiscal interventions, may continue to affect the Fund’s performance in future periods.

With strong economic and earnings growth forecast over the next two years, alongside a supportive policy backdrop, the sub-advisor believes that there could be upside of double digits in global equities over the next 12 months. While equity markets are expensive in absolute terms, they remain attractive in relative terms given the low yields available on assets such as bonds and cash. As the global economy moves from the early to mid-cycle stage, the sub-advisor expects equity returns to remain positive even as the pace of gains slows.

In the short term, equity markets could be vulnerable to some further modest downside on the back of a range of factors, including potential contagion from the fears like China’s largest property developer might become insolvent, bottlenecks associated with reopening of economies being more pervasive and longer lasting than expected and inflation being stickier than anticipated. Longer term potential risks to the positive outlook include unexpected central bank policy tightening, further significant rises in bond yields which would diminish the relative valuation

case for equities or a resurgence in COVID-19 cases with vaccines proving to be ineffective in treating new variants. The sub-advisor believes the probability of these occurring as low. Given elevated absolute valuations and the array of short-term risks facing markets, volatility is expected to remain a feature in markets.

The Fund is expected to remain unhedged against foreign currencies subject to Counsel’s discretion based on its assessment of currency market conditions.

Effective September 22, 2021, Atul Tiwari was appointed to the Counsel Funds’ Independent Review Committee.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

Top Funds represent nearly all of the Fund’s investors. As a result, Counsel pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund. No management or administration fees are paid by the Fund.

Other Related Party Transactions

Other investment funds managed by Counsel (“Top Funds”) invest in Series O securities offered by the Fund on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. At September 30, 2021, Top Funds owned 100% of the Fund’s NAV. As of September 30, 2021, Counsel had not received notice of any large redemptions. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day.

Counsel is a subsidiary of IGM Financial Inc. (“IGM”). IGM is a subsidiary of Power Financial Corporation, which in turn is a subsidiary of Power Corporation of Canada. Companies related to Power Corporation of Canada are therefore considered affiliates of Counsel. As at September 30, 2021, the Fund held investments in Power Corporation of Canada, Great-West Lifeco Inc. (a subsidiary thereof), and several overseas investments indirectly affiliated with IGM Financial Inc. through Power Corporation of Canada. The value of these investments was in aggregate \$0.5 million representing 0.2% of the Fund’s net assets. The IRC approved these policies on the basis that these investments:

- (i) are made free from any influence by an entity related to Counsel and without taking into account any considerations relevant to an entity related to Counsel;
- (ii) represent the business judgment of the sub-advisor, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund;
- (iii) made as part of a strategy where the value of such an investment is determined based on its relative weighting in an index; and
- (iv) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Past Performance

The indicated rates of return are the historical annual compound total returns, including changes in NAV per security and assuming reinvestment of all distributions. They do not take into account sales, redemption, distribution or optional sales charges, management fees directly payable by investors or income taxes payable by any investor that would have reduced returns. 

Year-by-Year Returns


The bar chart shows how much an investment made on the first day of each financial year would have increased or decreased by the end of the respective periods. For the first year of a series, the percentage

The higher PTR in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high PTR and the performance of the Fund. Costs incurred to realign the Fund’s portfolio after a fund merger, if any, are excluded from the PTR.
